Babysitter Training ...



Hands-on education to keep little one's safe & healthy.

It's called baby "sitting." Well, usually the last thing you do while watching a child is "sit." Young children keep you on your toes — and a proper babysitter needs to be ready for anything. The Dayton Area Chapter of the American Red Cross' Babysitter Training course teaches youth ages 11 to 15 the responsibilities and qualities of being a good babysitter. Infant

and child CPR, basic child care, safe play, first aid and professionalism are just some of the areas covered. We recommend any youth who babysits, or wants to start babysitting, participate in this course. The fee is \$50 for a one-day course, which includes a babysitter's training manual and a American Red Cross Babysitter's Backpack—complete with first aid supplies, mini-flashlight and important emergency information.
